The week started with the fantastic news that our application to Wellington College's Big Ambition Grants competition had been successful and we will receive a grant of £100,000! Earlier this year we submitted a bid to expand our science curriculum and improve the facilities within the department. This will include a new garden space, an expansion of our STEM extracurricular offer, and new equipment. Our bid was one of seventeen applications received by Wellington College and having evaluated our bid and completed a site visit of the school, the judges awarded us the grant - we could not be more excited about this news.

During the site visit our students played a crucial role and spoke so passionately and articulately about our school and the science department. I am so grateful to Cesere P, Samson F, Harvind J, Ariana T and James M. I am certain this will have influenced the judges' decision! This sort of opportunity comes along very rarely and the students should be really proud of the legacy this will leave for Sandhurst students for many years to come.

This year, between Wellington College, Bracknell Forest Council and the Corvus Learning Trust the school has been able to secure £1.2 million of investment into the school. Although this money could be spent many times over, it will make a real difference to us and allow us to take some significant strides towards having a learning environment we can be proud of. Thank you to everyone involved.

On Wednesday evening we held the Year 11 Prom at Pine Ridge Golf Club, all the students looked wonderful and enjoyed themselves thoroughly. It was a really good end to what has been a stressful year for them so it was great to be able to see the students relax and enjoy themselves. Pictures can be found later on in the newsletter.

As one year group leaves another one joins as we opened our doors on Wednesday and Thursday to our new Year 7 students who will be joining us in September. They have made a fantastic first impression and got stuck into all the activities available. Lots of work goes into organising these days so I would like to thank all the staff involved in making these such a success.

As if all of that wasn't enough, our Design and Technology department took a number of Year 7 students to Harry Potter World for a studio tour. The students were very excited and great ambassadors for the school. Again thank you to the staff that have given the students this opportunity.

We continue to do all we can to improve our school environment and we will be holding our final Make a Difference day on Saturday 13th July between 9.00am - 12.30pm. We will be focusing on the Maths department and all volunteers are very welcome. 






7th July - Islamic New Year


Most importantly, with seven teams competing in the tournament, this meant we had around 50 students all having fun playing the game they love!

This is certainly an accomplishment that only a select few can achieve! This has inspired Max and Lydia to keep improving in athletics and so there will be many more great competitions for them to follow!


