#### **Weekly Review**



#### Year 11 Football

On Monday evening our Year 11 Football team had their County Cup Final played at Ascot United FC against Waingels. This is a competition that Sandhurst have previously reached the final in but have never won. Our boys turned up excited for a positive performance and brimming with confidence. As kick off approached, the bumper crowd were very vocal in support of Sandhurst which just heightened the atmosphere.

The match started with a high intensity which set the tone for the full 80 minutes. Neither team were allowing each other much time on the ball and contested everything all over the pitch. We had the opening chance within a couple of minutes which sailed over the bar but it gave us confidence that we could be threatening. Waingels then had a spell with the ball where they demonstrated great interchanging passing in midfield and link up play with their striker. All of which our boys successfully dealt with and nullified. After 15 minutes Jake got on the ball down the right wing, got his head up to spot Rhys in the box and delivered a perfect cross which Rhys dispatched into the back of the net. An excellent start for the boys and the crowd more than showed their appreciation of the goal. The match continued to bounce back and forth, Waingels focusing on a possession style of play with little triangles in midfield, Sandhurst hounding the ball when out of possession but playing a clever counter attacking style. Both threatening in their own right. Chances came and went for both sides, nervy moments which on another day could have turned out different. On the half hour mark, Jake made an attacking run through the heart of the Waingels defence, Shamyok hit a perfect long pass which fell into Jake's stride. A potential offside but the linesman's flag stayed down, and with just the keeper to beat, Jake slotted the ball into the net. 2-0 and Sandhurst were flying! The half finished soon after and we were halfway there.

The boys returned to the changing rooms at half time confident. All the boys were giving each other feedback and motivating speeches. Knowing they were in a great position. A simple half time team talk of "more of the same" and to keep their heads, this was ours to lose and we knew Waingels were going to come at us in the search of a goal.

The second half was very similar to the first. Possession football being Waingels preferred choice of attack and Sandhurst hunting as a team to regain possession before playing on the counter attack. With spaces being left by Waingels who were looking for a goal, we enjoyed more attacks and looked certain to score again. Erik was providing a superb foundation in goal for us as were the rest of the back line. Waingels just could not create a clear cut chance as last ditch tackles or for Erik's saves keeping them at bay. With around 20 minutes remaining, Jake played the ball into Mo who wiggled and found a yard of space to fire a finish past their keeper. Absolutely ecstatic scenes in the crowd and the boys celebrated as a team in the corner. They knew they were there. Sensible play was required for the remainder of the match to see out the result. We kept the play simple, closing Waingels down when needed but remaining compact and keeping the energy levels up.







The crowd cheered and the boys roared as the referee's final whistle could barely be heard. Sandhurst had won the County Cup for the first time ever. What a proud moment for the boys and an outstanding achievement. Every single player could be chuffed with their performance and bathing in their moment of glory. The crowd welcomed the boys over for the trophy presentation with a rendition of "Green Army, Green Army". 13 smiling, excited, proud individuals leapt for joy as Jake lifted the shield above his head and water was used as makeshift champagne.

Well done to all of the boys, a fantastic achievement by all of you. You have done yourselves proud and as a PE department and a school we congratulate you.

## Is your child eligible for free school meals?

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400

a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

Your child may also get free school meals if you get any of these benefits and your child is both:

- younger than the <u>compulsory age for starting school</u>
- in full-time education



















This week in Year 7 Technology Club we have been making steady hand games. We definitely needed a steady hand to solder the wires together. We got them all working in the end.

New bras of all sizes (Excluding bikinis)










