Hajj 2024



14th - 19th June - Hajj

Hajj is an annual Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca, Saudi Arabia, the holiest city for Muslims. The annual Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca, is one of the Five Pillars of Islam and a fundamental religious duty for Muslims who are physically and financially able to undertake the journey. Occurring during the Islamic month of Dhu al-Hijjah, Hajj typically takes place once a year, attracting millions of pilgrims from around the world. The pilgrimage is a profound spiritual experience, symbolising unity and equality among Muslims as they embark on a journey of devotion, reflection, and repentance. Hajj holds immense significance in Islam, serving as a time for spiritual renewal, communal worship, and solidarity with fellow believers, transcending cultural and geographical boundaries to unite Muslims in a shared expression of faith.

14th - 19th June - Eid-al-Adha

Eid-al-Adha, also known as the Festival of Sacrifice, is one of the most important Islamic holidays celebrated by Muslims worldwide. Falling on the 10th day of Dhu al-Hijjah, the last month of the Islamic lunar calendar, Eid-al-Adha commemorates the willingness of Prophet Ibrahim (Abraham) to sacrifice his son Isma'il (Ishmael) as an act of obedience to God's command. However, before the sacrifice could be carried out, God provided a ram to be sacrificed instead. To honour this act of devotion and obedience, Muslims around the world observe Eid-al-Adha by performing the ritual of Qurbani, or animal sacrifice, typically of a sheep, goat, cow, or camel. The meat from the sacrificed animal is distributed among family, friends, and the less fortunate, symbolising charity and sharing with those in need. Eid-al-Adha is also a time for Muslims to come together for prayers, communal meals, and to strengthen bonds with family and community. It serves as a reminder of the importance of faith, sacrifice, and compassion in Islam, fostering a spirit of unity and generosity among believers.

Ms Mesley, our ever-enthusiastic librarian, meticulously crafted a series of complex puzzles that had students working together in teams. The energy in the library was electric!




