Headteacher's Weekly Review

Welcome to this week's newsletter.

As you will see we have been busy getting this school year off to a flying start. There is a lovely atmosphere around school and this week and next we, have or will have, many of our extra curricular clubs up and running.

It has been a week of change in education as Nadhim Zahawi has been appointed as the new Education Secretary. It is too early to make predictions about his tenure but what we hope for is a greater sense of strategy and support than in the past and an ambitious plan for post-Covid education recovery, significant investment in schools and colleges and a clear plan of support for children with special education needs. There are also conversations surrounding exams and courses such as BTEC and similar. I, like most school leaders am looking forward to the potential of this new partnership.

Covid still looms and we had 12 cases in one year group this week (Year 12) - but no more in that year group since Monday. This is a Year group with their own common room and so generally separate from other years. They have been wearing masks to move around school and in lessons.

Please all continue to do lateral flow tests. They are not perfect but they were helpful in initially identifying the Year 12 cases. I appreciate people may be fed up of these but it is helpful for all of us here in school in particular it may prevent an outbreak resulting in school closure.

Today there was a 'pre-official' announcement by the government that they are ending some of the travel restrictions for the 'double jabbed'. Great news potentially for the travel industry and those who want to travel.

In school our visits are already off the mark with a visit today to Kew Gardens - almost 100 Year 10, 11 and 12 art and photography students are out for the day. The buzz of excitement pre departure was palpable. Other visits planned for this term include Year 13 Geographers visiting Snowdonia and Year 10 carrying out their fieldwork in Reading. Catering students in Year 10, 11, 12 & 13 will be visiting the BBC Good Food Show and a visit to Borough Market is planned for Sixth Form only. Our Head of School Students (Sixth Form) are visiting the annual conference at Wellington College. We are - in line with the reduction in restrictions putting plans together for overseas visits too.

It was lovely to welcome the parents of potential Year 7 students last night and we are looking forward to hosting them at our Open Evening next week and school tours the week after.

We are following precautions to make sure that by inviting visitors to the school we are not risking the health of staff or current students and therefore risking school closure.

I hope you have a lovely weekend, if you get the chance to pop along to Yateley Gig on the Green and support Ms Hunt and her team who will have a stall at the event. The stall is supporting our school charity Reaching Rwanda.

Monday 6th September saw the arrival of our new Year 12 students joining Sandhurst Sixth Form. It's a really exciting time for them all as they embark upon their next chapter of learning with us. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday were packed full of induction activities to build the students up following their long summer break. After being away from school since May the 8th it was great to see them all arrive with such enthusiasm and excitement for a brand new challenge. We invited the National Citizens Service in to deliver our induction programme, so following a welcome assembly by Mrs Smith, Mrs Hunt and I, we got started!

On Monday, the students took part in a 'Post Covid Socialistion' session aimed to get the students reflecting on their experiences, the good and not so good aspects of the last 18 months, how their lives had changed, and to what extent. Tuesday was comprised of two further sessions; Health and Wellbeing, and Skills for Independent Living. As the students progress through their Sixth Form journey, we aim to help them develop as independent learners, as well as young adults who are prepared to enter adult life with confidence. Many of the themes covered, we will return to over the course of years 12 and 13. 




It is so nice to welcome all the students back into the RE department and start the new term. The Year 11s have come back fully focused on exam technique and the Year 10s have delved straight into their two year course with great enthusiasm.

In Year 9 the students debated the different factors and influences involved in an ethical dilemma and began to contemplate the different ways in which ethical decisions can be made. In Year 8 students explored the problem of evil, discussing whether evil was subjective, if and when evil should be prevented and if evil was a character trait or just the sum of a person's acts. In Year 7 we have begun our enquiry into how religions developed. The students discussed some of the big questions that early humans pondered that grew into the early seeds of religion.

Students throughout the Key Stages are asked to look at enquiry questions through different 'world lenses' be that religious, non religious, philosophical or sociological. In their lessons there is a big focus on their ability to discuss, debate and evaluate ideas.


At home try and hold a weekly discussion with your children about an issue in the media, it can even be one raised by a film. Ask your child to give evidence for their view point and consider what people from other 'world lenses' might think. On the Google Classroom in Key Stage 3 you will find an overview of enquiry questions for the course and some expected learning objectives for the current topic. Students are also given a list of key vocabulary that will enhance their understanding and improve the quality of their answers. Talking through these words, discussing the enquiry questions and learning objectives will support the learning that goes on in the classroom. 

























Science News

Our two u13's teams are looking for a referee. We play Saturday mornings at Harmanswater Playing Field, RG12 9QA.


