22nd April - World Earth Day



World Earth Day, observed annually on 22nd April, is a global initiative dedicated to environmental awareness and action. Established in 1970, Earth Day serves as a reminder of the importance of protecting our planet and promoting sustainable practices. The day brings attention to pressing environmental issues, including climate change, pollution, deforestation, and biodiversity loss. The theme for Earth Day 2024 is 'Planet vs Plastics'. Earth Day activities and events around the world encourage individuals, communities, and governments to take meaningful actions such as tree planting, clean-up campaigns, and advocating for policies that support environmental conservation. The day aims to inspire a collective commitment to preserving the Earth's natural resources, fostering environmental stewardship, and raising awareness about the interconnectedness of all living beings. 23rd April - St George's Day

St George's Day, celebrated on 23rd April, is an annual feast day honouring Saint George, the patron saint of England. Saint George is often associated with the legend of slaying a dragon, symbolizing the triumph of good over evil. 23rd - 30th April - Passover

Passover, or Pesach in Hebrew, is a significant Jewish festival that commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt. The central theme of Passover is the Exodus story, where Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt. The highlight of the festival is the Seder, a special ritual meal, during which the Haggadah (the story of the Exodus) is read, symbolic foods are consumed, and prayers are recited. Matzah, unleavened bread, is a key element of the Passover diet, symbolizing the haste with which the Israelites left Egypt, not allowing time for their bread to rise. Passover is a time for Jewish families to come together, reflect on their history, and reaffirm the principles of freedom and gratitude for deliverance.



We hope you had a restful and enjoyable break and that you are just as eager to be back in the classroom as we are.


