## Weekly Review

At Sandhurst School we are very fortunate to have young people and staff who come from every corner of the globe. This diversity of culture enriches our school and helps to promote tolerance and understanding. However, we believe that it is important to go even further than this – it is important for us to celebrate diversity and the range of cultures which make our school, and our society in general, what it is. There is so much we can learn from one another's cultures and such diversity makes our society, I believe, a far more interesting place.

To this end, next week we are going to hold two Cultural Celebration days, giving students a wide range of fun and educational experiences from a number of different cultures. The Year 7 and 8 day will be on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> June, followed by the day for Year 9, 10 and the Sixth form on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> June.

On the allocated day students in the year groups involved may wear their own clothes or cultural dress if they wish. The students will experience a number of workshops during the day. Examples include a Bollywood dance workshop, Caribbean and French cooking classes, a traditional Japanese hair and make-up workshop, Hawaiian ukulele tuition, Chinese calligraphy and beginners Mandarin, African drumming, an introduction to Nepali culture, a rap workshop, the evolution of black hair, Aborigine art, American football etc. In addition students will reflect upon their own identity and culture, creating a visual depiction which will contribute to a display in the school.

We intend for these days to be fun, educational and thought-provoking and we look forward to giving our students some new and enjoyable experiences. Hopefully we will have some lovely photos to put in the newsletter next week!

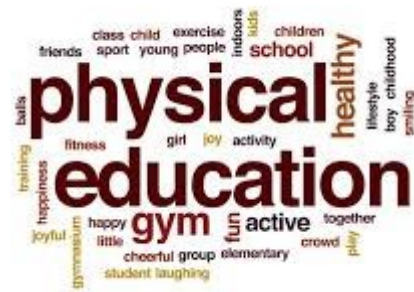

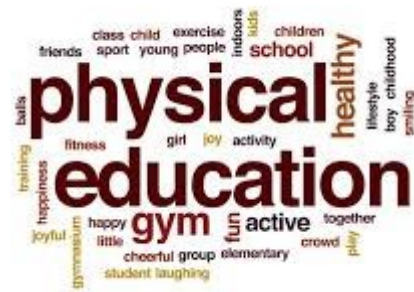

The girls team consisted of Belle, Sarah, Heidi, Isabelle, Hannah, Katie, Grace and Lily who were able to distribute the sprints, long distance events, jumps and throws between them to maximise the points. The girls did exceptionally well and won the girls' points competition, excelling both on the track and in field events. The girls finished the afternoon by winning the relay race which was a brilliant finale to the afternoon.

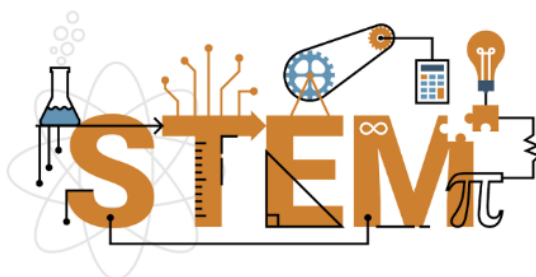

The course will run from the 20th June to the 14th August and can be completed flexibly around any other commitments. It is open to all students age 16+ and is suitable for all academic abilities with activities that cover different levels of advanced study. All you need is an interest in STEM subjects!

There is a £75 fee towards the cost of administration and the Industrial Cadets Silver award. There are bursaries available.

## **7. Keep it in perspective**

Whatever happens in your exams, you can still be successful in life afterwards and there will be lots of options open to you no matter what the results.

## **8. Believe in yourself**
