
We will miss her very much and wish her every happiness and success in her new role.



### **TheWheelerProgramme**

The Wheeler Programme is run by Wellington College for students from local state schools. It is a programme that supports students from Year 9 to 13 with a view to attending a top university.

This year, for the first time, we have chosen four students from Sandhurst School to go forward to the Wellington School interviews. A maximum of two students can be selected. The lucky two will attend days at Wellington College with visiting speakers and special events. In June they will attend a four day residential, where they will live and study with the Wellington students. This will happen every year until they leave in Year 13.

The school selection process was based on identifying some of the students with the potential to achieve top grades, but not necessarily currently achieving them in all subjects. This was the hardest part of the process, as we have so many gifted and talented students in Year 9, and we could not choose all of them.

Twelve were invited for interview, and again they were amazing, we found it very difficult to only choose four. We did even consider asking if we could send more than four, but four is our limit.

In January, Adam, Callum, Abbey and Nishtha will attend an interview at Wellington College. We hope that two of them will make it onto the programme for this year.

We have also started looking at the students in Year 8 to decide who we should select for this opportunity in 2023.

Thank you to all those who attended interview, you are a credit to the school and it was a pleasure to have a conversation with you.

Dear Parent/Carer,

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/CARERS REGARDING THE COVID-19 VACCINATION

The school-aged immunisation service will be visiting your child's school in the spring term of 2022. For most pupils, aged 12 years and over, this will be their 2nd dose, however if your child missed the 1st dose, this can still be given in the school setting. The service relies on parents providing up to date information to the service.

NB: For healthy children, there must be a 12-week interval between a 1st and 2nd dose of the Covid-19 vaccine\*.

\*If your child has been identified by his/her GP or consultant as clinically extremely vulnerable, or is living in the same household as someone who is immunosuppressed (e.g. receiving chemotherapy or has had an organ transplant), the recommended interval between a 1st and 2nd dose is 8 weeks, and he/she may require a 3rd and/ or booster dose. Parents will need to contact the GP to arrange further doses.

For children (not classified by their GP or consultant as clinically extremely vulnerable), it is not advised for them to have a Covid-19 vaccine within 12 weeks of a **laboratory positive PCR test** (this is different to a lateral flow test).

In January more details will be sent out through schools with a link to our consent form. Currently the National Booking Service will be opening for this cohort from the 20th December 2021, if your child is eligible and you wish for them to have it elsewhere please follow the link below.

To sum it all up


We are fine as we are
