Aspirational targets for all students are set in each subject. These are rigorously monitored to ensure all students are able to make outstanding progress. We have excellent relationships with our feeder schools and liaise extensively to ensure we are informed in the best ways to support our students following transition. Regular communication means that students and their parents are involved in the process of monitoring and tracking progress and also enables timely support to be given and early intervention strategies to be put in place.

Our philosophy here is based on growth mindset and so we encourage our students to be eager, curious and resilient learners who will take risks to learn and be prepared to rise to challenges.

# Caring, supporting and valuing individuals

In order for students to achieve their best they need to feel safe, secure and confident. Every individual at Sandhurst School is valued and nurtured. A student told Ofsted inspectors: "You can be whoever you want to be at this school and you don't have to conform to peer pressure because differences are celebrated."

Our pastoral support is a true strength and ensures that excellent relationships are at the heart of our school. Our highly regarded house system consists of four houses: Bailey, Gemini, Romer and Young and each is led by an experienced Head of House who works closely with tutors, supporting the care, guidance and encouragement of individuals in their group.

As well as an established house system, vertical tutor grouping ensures that role models in older years are able to guide and care for younger students. Students are trained as peer mentors to support those who are new to the school. All students receive individual and personalised support from the tutor who is kept informed of the progress of students in the group through close working with subject teachers. Daily tutor periods enable all students to start their day in familiar surroundings with their tutor who is then able to ensure any special support or consideration required on any given day is in place. Daily assemblies help build a strong ethos of mutual respect and loyalty and ensure students are informed and share in the school's journey.

## Responsibility for ourselves and others

t Sandhurst School we are committed to providing our students with the knowledge, skills and motivation to become responsible citizens who make a very positive contribution to our society and the wider world. We provide an exciting range of extracurricular opportunities, both in the UK and abroad, to support the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our students.







We aim to promote high standards of political literacy and to encourage students to become proactive 'upstanders' rather than passive bystanders when faced with the suffering and oppression of their fellow human beings. Our students engage in a wide variety of active citizenship projects which have an impact on the local, national and international communities.

On an international scale the school has developed its own charity, Reaching Rwanda, which supports survivors of the Rwandan genocide. Our students have the opportunity to develop close friendships with children in Rwanda and, working together, they have established a number of successful businesses in Rwanda and have provided homes, education and clean water facilities for many genocide orphans. Our key message is "Be the change that you want to see in the world" and Sandhurst School students certainly rise to this challenge.





### Inspire and celebrate

Te put great emphasis on rewarding and celebrating success. Our aim is to develop resilient, confident and motivated individuals who have the growth mindset to try new opportunities and take risks while feeling secure in the knowledge that they will be supported in all their endeavours. We want to equip our students for independence as well as fostering the desire for lifelong learning.

We enrich learning by inviting artists, authors, musicians and successful sports people into school to help subjects come alive for students. We also invite people whose real life struggle against adversity sometimes shock and often move and motivate our students.

We seek to know every student as an individual and to nurture their skills and talents. We know the value of reward and recognition, both formal and informal, as well as public and private. Success is celebrated in newsletters and assemblies and by creating leadership opportunities for prefects and peer mentors. Competition between the houses and school teams enables everyone to participate.

Relationships and good communication are vital because getting to know individuals and giving them the confidence to break from their comfort zone, whilst ensuring they know they are valued, important, and that what they do matters, will enable our school to continue to flourish.

he Sixth Form at Sandhurst School provides a challenging and supportive learning environment that encourages all students to achieve their very best. We offer a purposeful, structured approach to study in a friendly atmosphere. All students are supported in their learning by subject specialists and are cared for by a committed pastoral team. Students are assigned a form tutor who takes an active role in their transition from GCSE to A Level focusing on each student's welfare and progress until they leave school.

Our nurturing environment means we are able to know and care for our students on a personal level. However, we are big enough to provide the wide range of academic courses and enrichment opportunities which students demand. Our aim is to support the academic progress of every student. Sandhurst students achieve very well in their academic work, with outstanding academic guidance ensuring that challenging targets are met. Teaching and learning are effective because we have high expectations that reinforce our students' high aspirations.







We believe that two of the most important features of the Sixth Form are the quality of the teaching and the rigorous academic monitoring employed by the tutors and Sixth Form leadership team. Students are assessed regularly, receiving detailed feedback on their progress towards their target grades. Both students and parents are kept informed through academic progress reports and through conversations with a dedicated Sixth Form personal tutor.

Students leave our Sixth Form with a clear direction, a sense of responsibility to society and strong academic qualifications to realise their ambitions. Most of our Year 13 leavers go on to courses at their university of choice. Others pursue highly-regarded apprenticeships with local and national employers, pursue further training or go directly into employment.
