


## Positive Learning Routines

Unique parent code has been sent via email plus a welcome letter from the school was sent earlier today.




## ClassCharts - Reward Store





- Outstanding, the highest standards always met.
- Good, standards good much of the time, but occasional inconsistencies leave room for improvement.
- Inconsistent, standards are variable, unsatisfactory as often as satisfactory. This adversely affects progress.
- Unsatisfactory, standards are very inconsistent and often unacceptable. This is having a major impact on progress.



# Set 'Goals' not 'Targets'

- Use of KS2 results may not represent a students true ability, especially after the recent disruption to their education.
- Being able to predict what an individual's potential is for five years time is impossible and does provide 'the opportunity to succeed'. Potential should not be capped or limited.
- **Learning is not linear**, not being on target all the time can be a cause of stress, what matters is to identify the small incremental change needed to move the learning forward, for 'goals' to be set. To celebrate success.
- The intention is for students to reflect upon their own progress and enable their **aspiration to flourish**.
- Students will often surprise you. They turn out to have qualities, talents and skills that no one, not even they themselves, believed they had.



## Set 'Goals' not 'Targets'

 By giving a target, we imply there is a ceiling on a child's potential and this in itself may well create the low aspirations and low confidence.

We <u>do not believe</u> that anyone can achieve anything; rather, <u>we believe</u> that with dedication, industry and know-how individuals can make progress beyond what anyone, including themselves, could have imagined.


#### Curriculum






